

Habitat for Humanity of Brevard County (Habitat) YOUTH POLICY

- Youth volunteers 16 and 17 years of age may volunteer on an “active” worksite (when power tools are being used). However, they may not operate power tools and cannot work off ground level.
- Youth volunteers 14 and 15 years of age must be accompanied by an adult or guardian when working on a Habitat for Humanity of Brevard County (Habitat) worksite. They can participate in activities such as painting, landscaping / sod, laying vinyl floor tile and worksite cleanup but they may not be present on an “active” worksite.
- Youth volunteers who become a distraction and / or safety risk to themselves or others will be asked to leave the worksite.

Habitat for Humanity of Brevard County (Habitat) DRESS CODE

- For the comfort and safety of all who are present on the worksite, Habitat follows a simple, yet modest dress code.
- Volunteers must wear closed-toe shoes while on a worksite. Flip-flops, sandals, beach shoes or backless shoes are not permitted at the worksites.
- Short shorts, tank tops, low-cut or revealing tops are not allowed on any Habitat worksite.
- Clothing that restricts movement, i.e. too tight or too loose, or that can be viewed as offensive is not allowed on any Habitat worksite.
